They were ready to start work within hours of arriving. Their first impressions saw our Organ Curator Neil Warrington, breathe a massive sigh of relief. Richard and Peter noted that although the organ chambers are small, everything will fit, and the sound will get out. Even more satisfying, is that all the work that Neil and his team of helpers have undertaken over the last year or three, has made the Adelaide guys' work so much easier.

The two weeks passed all too quickly, and with help from our Auckland team, Richard and Peter had the pipe chests mounted in position in the chambers and the work of installing the pipes into the chests underway. However, Neil and his gang have a big list of "homework" to do before Richard and Peter return in January.


NEWS FROM THE ORGAN CHAMBERS!


Part of the Tibia rank of pipes.


