
## UP, UP AND AWAY ....!!

**Chris McPhee** is a much-loved performer here in Auckland with four visits in recent years to the Hollywood Wurlitzer. We've enjoyed Chris in a range of different combinations, as a Solo Artist; accompanying *Brett's New Internationals* 1920s style dance-band and sharing piano & organ with fellow Australian Ryan Heggie.

Chris is in regular demand for concerts around Australia and overseas. In mid-1999 he was featured in the American Theatre Organ Society's National Convention held in London, performing on the legendary Buddy Cole Wurlitzer.

Back home in Adelaide Chris is a popular artist at the prestigious Adelaide Town Hall and Festival Theatre pipe organs, performing for the Lord Mayors Christmas Concerts and Morning Melodies series. Chris is also a regular featured organist at the Capri Theatre.

Whilst a solo artist of renown, Chris has had the privilege to perform with some of Australia's top entertainers, including Tony Fenelon, Tasso Bouyessis, Anna-maria Beni, Rosanne Hosking, JC Jazz, The Bay Big Band and Adelaide Harmony Choir, to name just a few. He has produced 6 commercial recordings and his music has been featured on radio programs across the globe, including ABC's popular 'Classic Drive' program and the long running BBC broadcast, 'The Organist Entertains'.

Joining Chris for this program is fellow entertainer **Rosanne Hosking.** With over 20 years' experience in the entertainment industry, Rosanne's genuine love and passion for singing and performance shines through in everything she does.



Possessing natural warmth and an quality, she is able endearing to connect with audiences and students, young and old. Rosanne's performance taken career has her all around Australia and overseas. She was voice at Adelaide's studvina Elder Conservatorium when she accepted her first professional engagement with the Australian Cast of The Phantom of the Opera. She has since diversified into all music styles and has explored her versatility on the operatic, natural musical theatre, cabaret and contemporary stage.

Rosanne and Chris have performed on a number of occasions together, and they are preparing a thrilling program for their Auckland Show. It will definitely be a "Pops" program that includes some of the hits of Edith Piaf, some Light Opera, the great Burt Bacharach, Andrew Lloyd Webber and much more......

## BEWARE THE WRATH OF THE CHURCH ORGANIST

This wee gem I discovered recently on the website of the Daily Telegraph in the U.K..

#### Beware the wrath of the church organist – musical revenge is sweet! They are the stalwart pillars of the community whose week-in, week-out dedication has kept the country's choral traditions alive for generations.

But, if new research is be believed, behind the quiet exterior the humble church organist is not someone to be crossed.

While charged with providing spiritually uplifting music to worshippers, it seems many also seize the opportunity to extract subtle revenge on clerics who have displeased them or simply play pranks on congregations.

A survey of churchgoers found that at least half have noticed their organist straying from the path of musical orthodoxy at some point – slipping snippets of heavy metal classics, advertising jingles and even nursery rhymes into hymns and anthems.

In some cases it can be a means of waging musical war with clerics while in others it is simply an effort by bored organists to make the choir laugh.

Christian Research, a polling and research group asked its 2,000 strong "Resonate" panel of churchgoers for their views on church music and organists.

Of those who responded, half said they had noticed an organist slipping unexpected tunes into services.

Among examples cites was that of the organist in Scotland who had fallen out with some of the elders in the Kirk but got his own back by inserting a thinly disguised rendition of "Send in the Clowns" as they processed in for a Sunday service.



Elsewhere, a vicar sacked an organist after he played "Roll out the Barrel" at the funeral of a man known to have been fond of a drink.

decidedly high In church one congregation, an organist punctured the mood of reverence as an elaborately dressed clergyman processed back after the gospel reading - by playing the theme tune to The Simpsons.

Another congregation found themselves passing around the collection plate to the strains of "Money, Money, Money" by Abba.

The survey uncovered examples of Eucharist celebrations livened up with renditions of Bon Jovi's "Livin' on a Prayer"; the theme tunes from the Magic Roundabout, Blackadder and Harry Potter and even "I've Got a Lovely Bunch of Coconuts".

Sung Evensong – widely regarded as the jewel in the crown of English choral music – has been spiced up with such unexpected offerings as "I'm a Barbie Girl" and "I'm Forever Blowing Bubbles"

One organist, who responded, confessed to playing hits by Oasis, Billy Bragg and even Kylie Minogue in services but added: "Nobody notices – I do it all the time."

But when an organist played a sloweddown version of Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious from Mary Poppins, even the most tone deaf members of the congregation eventually recognised, sending them into gales of laughter.

An older bridegroom took it in good humour when the organist played "No one loves a fairy when she's 40" at his wedding" while candidates at a confirmation service were left perplexed to hear the strains of "I'm a Little Teapot" from the organ loft.

Stephen Goddard, of Christian Research, said: "It's an oft-repeated adage in church circles – 'What's the difference between an organist and a terrorist? -you can negotiate with a terrorist'.

"Hidden from view, your local church organist may appear unassuming and self-deprecating, but like any true artist, he or she can be eccentric, mischievous and very opinionated.

"Mess with him at your peril – he will pull out all the stops to get his own back."

The poll was conducted ahead of the Christian Resources Exhibition, a trade fair for all things ecclesiastical in London later this month, which will be showcasing new organs among other things



#### SATURDAY APRIL 25 (ANZAC DAY) at 2pm – "Sounds of Silents – WINGS 1927 Silent Movie"

We have had many fun afternoons of music with John Atwell over the years as he has performed alongside an Auckland based 1920s Dance Band, piano, trumpet and vocalist.... Now a new dimension as John accompanies a great classic from the silent movie era, "**Wings**" made in 1927 and regarded as one of the last great classics from the silent movie era.

See and hear how the Wurlitzer organ brings the silent movie to life through the power of music!!

#### SUNDAY APRIL 26 at 2pm – "The Music that Got Us Through the War Years!"

John Atwell returns to the console, this time to share some of the most wellknown music ever written.

The program features music from some of the darkest days in our history.... The First World War, World War 2, the Korean War of the 50s and the Vietnam War of the 60s. Each period saw music written and songs sung that will ever remain in the public mind and will always be associated with that particular theatre of war.

Most of this music turns out to be some of the liveliest and happiest music ever written, again all designed to lift our spirits and give us the strength to soldier on!!

Join us for an afternoon of fun music at this, our tribute to the music from the war years.

As one of the younger generation of Australian theatre organists, Chris enjoys the opportunity to work with other talented artists and for this trip, he is joined by Rosanne Hosking also from Adelaide.

#### SUNDAY AUGUST 30 at 2pm – Jelani Eddington (USA)

Now a real thrill as we welcome back to the Hollywood, one of the USA's younger generation theatre organists. Jelani is a true consummate musician and over the years, he has become a much-loved entertainer to Auckland audiences, since his first visit in 1996 at the age of twenty-two. Definitely a program that will feature music for all tastes, from the classics, movie & TV themes, the 20s & 30s, and right on up to today – "Pops on Pipes" this certainly is! A great afternoon indeed is in store with this very popular international touring artist.

#### SATURDAY OCTOBER 3 at 2pm THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA 1925 Silent Movie"

Another "great" from the silent movie era, and for this screening, the USA's Dave Wickerham will be at the console of the Hollywood Wurlitzer to use all the organ's resources to bring the silent screen to life.

Currently enjoying a resurgence of interest, this 1925 silent horror classic, stars Lon Chaney, Sr. in the title role of the deformed Phantom who haunts the Paris Opera House, causing murder and mayhem in an attempt to make the woman he loves a star. The movie remains most famous for Chaney's ghastly, self-devised make-up, which was kept a studio secret until the film's premiere.

#### SUNDAY OCTOBER 4 at 2pm

#### Dave Wickerham (USA)

In a complete change of pace from the drama of the silent movie, Dave Wickerham will share some lively toetapping music with us in another true "Pops" style program.

Who could forget Dave's last visit back in 2012, when he invited his audience to note down their favourite requests during the interval, and then featured almost every item requested during the second half! This proving the amazing virtuosity of this great keyboard entertainer

The audience yelled for MORE! So in answer to that call, here he is!

#### SUNDAY NOVEMBER 8 at 2pm — "PIPES n' PIZZAZZ" Scott Harrison (AUS) with Tauranga's Bay Dixie Band)

Join us for a fun afternoon of "Dixie Jazz" when the Wurlitzer pipe organ and Tauranga's Bay Dixie Band join forces to make music together.

The combination of the Dixie band and pipe organ recreates some of the hottest sounds in music since the great Fats Waller first featured this mix back in the 1920s.

Scott Harrison from Melbourne and the Bay Dixie Band were featured at the Hollywood Cinema last year and our audience were VERY vocal in their desire to hear more of this magic combination!

What a spectacular way to conclude this vintage 1926 Wurlitzer pipe organ's 32nd year of entertaining Auckland at the Hollywood Cinema.


