# <u>NEWS FROM THE WESTERN FRONT</u>

In January, as planned, the organ was moved from MOTAT's storage facility to now sit in a million pieces on the Playhouse Theatre stage in readiness for installation.

However, following on from still further delays, the builder of the organ chamber annex is only just now, finally on the home straight. With the building delays we have lost our window of opportunity with the Melbourne Organ builders and the theatre itself, to begin installation, planned for February thru March.

With end-March looming fast, our major concern was now the need to move the organ from the stage, to permit theatre hires to come in from April 1<sup>st</sup>. But move the organ to where?? Then along comes the Covid-19 virus to change everything. Theatre hirers have cancelled their bookings through to June, giving our team opportunity now to prepare the chambers for the Aussie team to come over, but....because of the closed borders now, they cannot travel. So, things are at a stalemate! But with the theatre closed, we now have some breathing space to regroup and put Plan C?? in to place.

Amid all this doom & gloom, came a ray of sunshine in the form of a wonderful donation towards the organ project from the MOTAT Society. Although the MOTAT (Museum of Transport & Technology) Society no longer directly runs the museum, today it acts as a supporting society, offering an extended knowledge base in support of the Museum's preservation and conservation efforts. The Society's membership is made up of current and former MOTAT volunteers and staff, and general enthusiasts with transport, technology and heritage interests, as well as affiliations with kindred organisations. WOTA is extremely grateful to the MOTAT Society for their gift.
