Remember when Auckland's historic Wurlitzer pipe organ entertained thousands each year at Avondale's Hollywood Cinema? With the sale of the theatre last year the Wurlitzer had to be removed and placed in storage pending a new home. To celebrate the music and memories of the theatre organ, the Wurlitzer Organ Trust of Auckland in association with **MusicPlanet**, is presenting a special show with Melbourne keyboard artist **Scott Harrison** at the Allen TH300 digital theatre organ - the closest we can get to the sounds of the mighty Wurlitzer.




The show will include quest artists, Auckland Dixie Band "B.B.C" performing with Scott and the organ, plus a short silent movie featuring footage of the Wurlitzer Organ Factory in North Tonawanda, New York, in the 1920s when the company was shipping a complete organ a day to meet orders from theatres world-wide. Our Wurlitzer organ was shipped from this factory on October 15, 1926 - 90 years ago this year!

Scott Harrison was one of the many popular artists featured on the Wurlitzer organ back in our "Hollywood Days", and it is a great pleasure to welcome him to the Playhouse to share more of his lively "jazz-style" music on the organ.

Your Editor has also had the pleasure of working with the Dixie-band BBC on another venture and I know you are going to love their fun music-making, in a couple of solo items and together with Scott on the Allen organ.

This show is being presented as part of Auckland Council's "Heritage Festival" so we are expecting good support from followers of this annual event. Remember the Playhouse Theatre seats 240, so please do not leave your booking to the last minute because you WILL be disappointed if the show sells out!!

We know that many of you are missing the sounds of the Wurlitzer pipe organ and we are mindful that we have only presented three events this year, so to end our year; the Trust decided a trip to our sister Wurlitzer was well overdue!!

The Tauranga Wurlitzer was shipped one week after ours in 1926, it going to the De Luxe (later renamed the Embassy) Theatre in Wellington – that makes both organs 90 years old THIS YEAR!! We need to celebrate!

Our friends in the *Tauranga Theatre Organ Society* have offered to host us should we consider a visit – well we don't need to be asked twice.



Here's what we are planning;

- > 8.30am Coach will depart from New Lynn Railway Station
- > 9.am depart Onehunga Railway Station
- > 11.30am approx. arrive Baycourt in Tauranga
- Light lunch served
- > Auckland and Tauranga players will share their music with us on the beautiful 2/11 Wurlitzer pipe organ
- > 3pm approx coach will depart Tauranga for return to Auckland with drop-offs at Onehunga and New Lynn Railway Stations

We have booked an **Abbots Coach** for the day which seats 50 people, but we must sell every seat! At the very worst – ticket price would be \$40 each, but we are working towards reducing this.



WOTA IS LOOKING FOR AN AUDITOR

After many years of looking after the Wurlitzer Organ Trust of Auckland, our current Auditor is retiring, so we need someone to take his place. Our Trust Deed requires us to have an annual audit. Our requirements are as follows;

- An accountant who is or has been in public practise, or is or has had an accounting career in the private or public sector
- Verifiable accounting qualifications
- Excel Spreadsheet experience

Our accounts are Cash based. The Trust Cash Book is maintained in an Excel Spreadsheet and a copy of this file would be supplied. Weekly Bank Reconciliations are in hard copy. All payments are authorised by two of three Trust signatories, and approved by the full Trust at subsequent Trust Meetings. The Trust is supplied with a Financial Report detailing Receipts, Payments, Bank Accounts and Investments, at each of its meetings. Trust Meetings are usually held every six weeks or as required.

The Trust is heavily dependent on external funding and donations to continue its operations. Accordingly, it is unable to pay commercial rates and seeks an Auditor who will act on a pro bono or limited fee plus reasonable expenses basis.

Copies of the Trust's Financial Statements, Trust Deed and Officers are available on the Charities Services Website <u>www.charities.govt.nz</u> Trust Financial Statements must now be prepared in the Tier 4 format stipulated by Charities Services.

PLAYHOUSE THEATRE UPDATE

At long last we do have some positive news!!! Following further meetings in May between the Waitakere Playhouse Theatre Trust (WPTT) and the Wurlitzer Organ Trust of Auckland (WOTA), we have received a formal invitation to bring the Wurlitzer organ to the Playhouse Theatre, and make the Playhouse the new home for theatre organ entertainment in Auckland!

It has been agreed that the organ chambers will be built on to the back of the stage and this work is to coincide with another project the WPTT was embarking on for 2017, the building of a multi-purpose space over the Green Room.

Mr Graham Upton, one of our FOTW members who is an architect and has experience with heritage buildings, offered his services and has been engaged by the WPTT to prepare the drawings, plans and documentation which will be submitted to Auckland Council for resource consent. There are a number of hooks to be managed because of the heritage listing on the Playhouse building.

The cost of merely submitting plans for review and consent, when there is a heritage edge to them, is just over \$10,000. The WPTT and WOTA are rightfully sharing this initial expense, which means that we now need to find within a few short months, around \$5000!

Two requests for funding support to our usual funding agencies have been declined, and as our shows usually only break-even and do not make money as such, we are watching our remaining funds disappear at the rate of \$1000 a month to cover the storage cost of the Wurlitzer organ. While a couple of members have offered alternative storage in sheds or large warehouses, it must be said that where the organ is currently stored, the facility is temperature controlled and vermin proof – it's costly here but the organ is in the best and safest place possible.

Not one of the funding agencies we have approached will cover or assist with storage costs despite the fact that it will ultimately see the return of the organ to the music scene here in Auckland. So we must go it alone.

So my friends, once again we turn to you for some help with the \$5000 needed to get this project for the organ's new home started. Something to think about.....

At this critical time in WOTA's history, these gifts are essential to aid the Trust in keeping solvent and continuing to ensure the Wurlitzer organ is in safe hands while in storage.

PLEASE REMEMBER....


With a new venue, we have some new terms and conditions of use at the Playhouse Theatre.

- No food or drink in the auditorium, so suggest you come earlier so you can enjoy your coffee from the Café 2 U coffee van before going in for the show.
- > Because of the Performing Rights Act absolutely NO video or audio recording

Why not try our new electric trains when attending a show at the Playhouse?? The Swanson service is half-hourly and the theatre is literally 5 minutes' walk from the Glen Eden Station!

A Train departs Britomart at 12.54pm and arrives at Glen Eden at 1.32pm. Trains depart Glen Eden at 5.08 or 5.38pm for the return journey.

If coming by car there is limited parking down the driveway beside the theatre – use spaces marked with a \mathbf{PH} as these are for Playhouse patrons.
